## Campaign Kick-off: A day of community service

United Way @ Work served as the kick-off for our 95<sup>th</sup> annual campaign. The event drew a crowd of more than 200 volunteers who attended an early breakfast and presentation in the center concourse of the Eastwood Mall.

Eric Lanham, Senior Vice President of Marketing for 7 17 Credit Union and Vice Chairman of the United Way of Trumbull County’s Board of Directors, thanked this year’s Pacesetters and praised them for their leadership. A complete list of our 2018 Pacesetters are highlighted on page 5.

United Way of Trumbull County President Ginny Pasha talked about all the good work being done in Trumbull County because of our volunteers and our donors, followed by Matt Martin, Executive Director of Trumbull Neighborhood Partnership and UWTC Board Member, who thanked the volunteers in advance for their hard work and commitment to helping others in their community.

Trumbull Neighborhood Partnership plays a big role in the planning of the day’s volunteer activities. Denise Rising of TNP was also thanked for her collaboration and commitment to making the day successful.

The breakfast concluded with motivational music sung by the musical group For Grace, which included singer and UWTC Board Member, Van Nelson.

The Cafaro Foundation and Mercy Health St. Joseph Warren Hospital were the event’s premier Leadership sponsors. Other sponsors included Kent State University at Trumbull, Akron Children’s Hospital Mahoning Valley, Western Reserve Building Trades and the Raymond John Wean Foundation. In-kind donations were provided by Panera Bread, Lowe’s Home

Improvement Warehouse and The Home Depot.

Following the kick-off, volunteers visited sites across the county in Cortland, Howland, Liberty, Lordstown, Niles and Warren, where they provided hands-on services at area seniors, veterans and physically and/or financially unable homeowners’ properties who have been unable to keep up with their outdoor yard projects.

The residential properties selected were referred and vetted through a partnership with Trumbull Neighborhood Partnership, Scope Senior Services, Trumbull Mobile Meals, Second Baptist Church and area public officials.

Outdoor projects included a variety of yard work that also involved reattaching a porch skirting, completing various painting projects and adding fill dirt to help prevent one homeowner from injury.

# Reading Great by 8

LITERACY INITIATIVE  
A United Way of Trumbull County Initiative

## Finding innovative ways to improve childhood literacy

Our goal is that every child in our community can read at grade level by grade three!

Our Reading Great by 8 programs are currently in 16 school districts throughout Trumbull County, with Niles City School District becoming the most recent participant of the initiative's Ready Set Go program.

Through this initiative, United Way of Trumbull County works with area schools to find innovative ways to help students improve their literacy skills. Our Reading Great by 8 consists of the following three programs:

- *ABC Reading Ready* is a two week summer intervention program focused on improving reading skills of children transitioning from kindergarten to first grade with an emphasis on children from low-to-moderate income households. Educators have identified this as a crucial transition for children to read at grade level by the third grade.
- *Ready Set Go* helps students attain reading success over the summer and prevents summer learning loss. It is intended for second graders transitioning to third grade who are reading below grade level with an emphasis on children from low-to-moderate income households. The books selected for this year exposed the students to geology. One activity included finding a hidden gem inside a rock. One student was so excited she wants to be a geologist when she grows up!
- *Read 4 Fun* is a program available to all students in grades K-3 that is designed to build students' confidence and creativity through fun and unique reading experiences. Volunteers read to students on Dr. Seuss's birthday in March, and thanks to a partnership with the Eastwood Mall, classrooms have the opportunity to compete in the Seuss-tastic Reading Challenge. Winning classrooms from the Seuss-tastic Reading Challenge are awarded an all-expense paid field trip to Dr. Seuss's BIG Birthday Bash at the Eastwood Mall, where they enjoy lunch in the food court, celebrity story time, and create a Seuss-tastic craft! Volunteer readers also provide story time to students on select days in October and November. Students create a story-themed craft, eat a healthy snack and receive a book bag containing 3 to 5 books for home.

These programs are available at no cost to the students or school districts thanks to special funding provided by our partners *Arcelor-Mittal Foundation, The Cafaro Foundation, Chemical Bank, Lipscher Foundation, Kinsman United Methodist Church, Kiwanis Club of Warren, Rotary Club of Kinsman, and Routh-Hurlbert Real Estate.*

### COMMUNITY SERVICE

*The residents are always so appreciative of our efforts to make their little piece of the world more beautiful. It's a truly rewarding experience,"* adds Thorp.

Volunteers also spent the morning with Friends of the Mahoning River and members of the Youngstown Air Reserve Station, where they focused on clean-up efforts along the Veterans' Path, Perkins Park and other hard to reach areas nearby. Other volunteers provided services at agency partners; Second Harvest Food Bank of the Mahoning Valley, Trumbull Mobile Meals and Someplace Safe.

*"In one sense it's like a teambuilding exercise with our Dean. This year was particularly special because the homeowner-in-need came out and did what he could do to work with us. We left there feeling like we made a huge difference,"* said Bill Burgess, Marketing Coordinator at Kent State University at Trumbull.

# Reading Great by 8 Photo Highlights



## Did you know?

- Children are **learning to read** until third grade. By fourth grade they should be **reading to learn**.
- After fourth grade, coursework gets harder and reading proficiency becomes more challenging.
- Students who don't read well have increasing difficulty keeping up, leading to bad grades, disengaging from school, and dropping out.
- In fact, children who aren't reading at grade level by the end of third grade are four times as likely to drop out of high school.


Though many of us may not realize the critical hunger disparities; thousands of seniors, children and families agonize daily about being hungry.

### Did you know that more than 33,000 people in Trumbull County struggle with hunger?

That's *one* in every *six* people and *one* in every *four* children who do not have enough food to live or maintain a healthy lifestyle, which in essence causes physical, social and psychological problems in both adults and children. These people are our neighbors, classmates, students and many people we may or may not know. Many of them don't even know where or when there will find their next meal.

As part of the solution, United Way of Trumbull County partners with Second Harvest Food Bank and others to place food pantries inside three of Warren City Schools; Willard Pre K-8, Jefferson Pre K-8 and Warren Harding High School. Beginning last year, students who have a need for food while at school or at home can discreetly select what they need and take it with them.

# Agency Impact Funds Awarded
